The Human Environment

Official Course Description:

The study of people, their origins, culture, technology, economy and impact on the environment. The manner in which people attempt to impose order upon the surface of the earth. Concepts of relative location are introduced with particular regard to both the external orientation and the internal organization of urban areas.

Prerequisite:

Geography 205 or admission to the Major or Minor in Geography, Earth Science, Environmental Science, Urban Studies, Latin American Studies or Transportation Studies or the Major in East Asia.

Text:

No textbook is required for this course. All text material and class notes will be available on Blackboard.

Grading (Weighting):

(1) Lab assignments	40%
(2) In-class exams	60%

(1) Lab sessions will begin in the week of September 25. Dates of subsequent labs will be posted on Blackboard by the TA.

Lab exercises will where possible complement the classroom studies.

(2) Three in-class exams will be held. All three will consist of short-answer questions, designed mainly to test the students' understanding of the material covered in class. Some memorization maybe required.

Exams will be held on October 11 (25%), November 15 (25%) and December 8 (10%).
