Official Course Description:

This class covers physical principles of meteorology and climatology. We consider weather development in relation to different scales of atmospheric circulation, elements of synoptic and dynamic climatology, and the global energy balance. Course content includes patterns of global climate and introductory principles of climate change. Laboratory work emphasizes North American examples.

Problem Set

There will one take-home assignment, worth 10%. This will consist of some calculations, analysis of weather and climate data, and discussion of theoretical material that we cover in class.

Labs

There will be a series of six labs over the semester, held roughly every other week and worth 30% of your final mark (6% each). Lab 1 will be held the week of September 20-24.

Quizzes and Final Exam

There will be five 20-minute quizzes held in class, based on the lecture material and reading assignments. I will take the top 4 of 5 quizzes (totalling 25% of your final mark). Quizzes will begin promptly at the start of class and will run from 14:00-14:20.

There will also be a final exam, worth 35%, to be scheduled by the Registrar. The quizzes and final exam will be made up of short-answer questions to test your understanding. The final exam will be cumulative, testing your ability to integrate the course content.
