Official Course Description

This course applies GIS and remote sensing techniques to the study of biogeographical patterns, processes, and environmental change. Wildlife are used as an entry point to understanding species-environment relationships and the effects of landscape change. However, techniques used in this class may be extended to any spatial phenomena and therefore should be of interest to students from a broad range of disciplines (e.g. urban development, planning and management, transportation science, as well as wildlife management and conservation). Topics include quantifying habitat fragmentation, species-environment relationship modelling, parametric and non-parametric statistics in ecological analysis, information theoretic approaches, and spatial decision support systems. Labs combine GIS and statistical evaluation to reinforce theory covered in lecture. Readings are assigned for group discussion, and are chosen to support lab and lecture content. Other aspects of this course include the evolution of spatial ecology as a discipline and the use of indicator, umbrella keystone and flagship species in conservation.
